BRIEF REPORT ON THE PROGRAM: Sri Vasudeva Rao is an expert in providing important inputs to prepare competitive exams. He has explained how to prepare for the competitive exams namely UPSC, APPSC and other Competitive Exams. The following is the gist of chief guest speech.

UPSC Exams: The Union Public Service Commission (UPSC) conducts various competitive exams in India to recruit candidates for civil service positions in the central government. The most prominent exam conducted by the UPSC is the Civil Services Examination (CSE). It is often referred to as the UPSC exam or the IAS exam. Here are some key points about UPSC exams:

Syllabus: The syllabus for UPSC exams covers a wide range of topics, including current affairs, history, geography, polity, economics, science and technology, environment, and more.

Preparation: UPSC exams require thorough and consistent preparation. Candidates often refer to various study materials, NCERT textbooks, standard reference books, newspapers, and magazines for preparation. Coaching institutes and online platforms also offer guidance and test series to help candidates prepare.

APPSC Exams: Andhra Pradesh Public Service Commission (APPSC) conducts various exams to recruit candidates for state government positions in Andhra Pradesh. Here are some key points about APPSC exams:

Group 1, 2, and 3 Exams: The APPSC conducts Group 1, Group 2, and Group 3 exams to fill vacancies in administrative, executive, and other services of the state government.
