PREFACE

Government College (Autonomous), Anantapur started in 1916, is the oldest and the most prestigious institution in Rayalaseema (Southern A.P.) area. This college has completed 107 years of yeoman service to the noble cause of education. On 8th July 1916 this college was started as the Ceded District College (A Second Grade College) with Sri S. E. Ranganathan as its first Principal. To start with, there were 41 students, spread over the different faculties of History, Telugu, Kannada, Sanskrit and Logic under Part - II. In the early years of its functioning, besides the eminent Principal Sri S. E. Ranganathan, Dr. S. Radhakrishnan, teacher of the teachers, ennobled the cause of education in the institution by his service as a member staff. He worked as a Tutor in Philosophy in the college.

The College is affiliated to Sri Krishnadevaraya University, Anantapur. The UGC granted Autonomous status to this college during the academic year 2016-2017 for a period of six years which will be extended from time to time. Under the Autonomous Grade set up, the college introduced Semester system with CBCS pattern. The college has been accredited thrice at 'A" Grade by NAAC. It has also been ranked as the best college by NIRF and India Today rankings.

The College has a potential of 152 faculty and 51 non-teaching and supporting staff and presently offers 22 programmes at the U.G. level and 10 programmes at P.G. level. Around 4100 students are now pursuing Higher Education in this institution, out of which 70% belong to S.C., S.T., and B.C categories.

The college collects feedback from students, academic peers, alumni and industries. The feedback obtained is analyzed, discussed and conclusions drawn are utilized for future improvement in curriculum development, introduction of better programmes and for sustaining academic growth of the institution. The institution has a transparent admission process. Admissions into UG Programmes are taken as per the online admission allotment made by Andhra Pradesh State Council of Higher Education (APSCHE). Parents are invited at the time of admissions. In respect of P.G. programmes rank obtained at a common entrance test (APPGCET) conducted by APSCHE is taken into consideration and admissions are made by the University authorities. Academically backward and disadvantaged students are identified and taken care of by conducting remedial classes in all subjects. Tutorial classes are conducted for all students before or after the college hours. Students

admitted are put to constant observation following ward counseling system. Innovative teaching learning methods include Students' open forum, Freedom of Expression, Problem Solving Sessions, Quiz Point, Inspiration Point, Knowledge Point, Web oriented Assignments, Class room Seminars, Group Discussions, Quiz competitions and Socio, Economic surveys. English language laboratory enables the students to acquire communicative skills and other English language improvement techniques.

Coaching classes for various competitive exams are conducted by the faculty members of this college in the larger interests of the students. Comprehensive annual academic plans are prepared incorporating innovative teaching, learning methods, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. The college facilitates the conduct of seminars, conferences, workshops and other faculty development programmes. ICT training programmes are conducted for staff at least twice in a year. So far, thirty teachers have received AP State Best Teacher Awards.

The college follows self-appraisal methods by teaching staff duly following the parameters of Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, A.P., UGC and NAAC. Knowledge and Skills acquired by the students are assessed continuously by conducting unit tests, terminal examinations, pre final examinations and model practical examinations. Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) is part of evaluation process. Syllabus, annual academic schedule, previous question papers and principles of evaluation are communicated to the students at the beginning of the academic year. The institution encourages research culture among the faculty members through the Faculty Development Programmes offered by UGC.

Research committee is constituted to monitor academic research and to provide facilities. 15 Minor Research Projects funded by UGC, SERO Hyderabad are completed. Faculty offers consultancy service to local public, farmers, other colleges, neighborhood industries and non-government organizations. The college responds to the local community needs by conducting socially useful programmes like Adult Literacy Programmes, Blood Donation Camps, AIDS Awareness programmes, Eye Testing Camps, Gender Sensitization, Water Harvesting, Health and Nutrition programmes, Pulse Polio immunization programmes, Socioeconomic surveys, adoption of villages and slums, voter enrolment and other extension activities.

There are 2 units of NCC, one for men and another for women and 8 units of NSS. Cadets of NCC and volunteers of NSS participate regularly in extension activities, Special Camps, National integration camps and Republic Day parade in New Delhi. Departments of Commerce, Political science and Economics conducted Socio Economic Surveys as part of society outreach programmes. The institution has adequate infrastructure facilities consisting of 43 class rooms, 26 laboratories, a central library, and 300 systems. 143 systems have internet connectivity. Three play grounds covering an area of more than 5 acres are available for conduct of sports and games like football, basketball, hockey, cricket, volleyball, etc. The college central library offers different types of services to the students and faculty and has more than 1,00,000 rare and latest volumes with open access system, borrow system and 9 computers having internet facility. Every department has departmental library and SC/ST book bank. Both men and women students are encouraged to participate in co-curricular and extracurricular activities like debates, elocution, essay writing, quiz competition etc. Eco club, Literary Association, Women Empowerment cell. Grievance Redressal Cell, Academic and Career Guidance cell, District Resource Center, Consumer Protection cell, Internal Quality Assurance Cell, Jawahar Knowledge Centre etc. help students to update their knowledge. Student charter of the Government of Andhra Pradesh and NAAC are followed.

Financial support is provided by way of scholarships to students of marginalized sections of society. DRC arranges guest lectures in all GDCs of the district by allotting the staff of other GDCs. Also, it sponsors Workshops, Quiz Programs, etc., at district level. Dr. B. R. Ambedkar open university study center and Telugu Academy Book Center have been maintained by the principal as Coordinator. About 300 inmates are residing in college attached student managed men's hostel which is in the college premises. A Women's hostel is constructed and commenced during 2014-2015 to accommodate 250 women students.

Transparency and accountability is ensured in all matters at all levels through a meticulous observance of rules and regulations, which are in force. College Planning and Development Committee (CPDC), Staff Council and the other committees, some comprising students, regularly conduct meetings and take decisions assuring transparency and accountability in the matters like infrastructure,

academic, administrative and financial aspects of the institution. The proactive Internal Quality Assurance Cell co-ordinates the academic ambience of the institution interacting with the lecturers-in-charge of all departments, experts from local community and local industry. Jawahar knowledge centre provides different types of skills to the students to make them employable at the exit level and organizes Job melas and campus recruitment drives in the campus.

This institution is reaccredited at 'A' grade thrice achieving a C.G.P.A score of 3.13. The involvement of all teaching, non-teaching and support staff has been total and phenomenal in the march of the institution on its journey towards quality because Quality is a Journey but not a Destination.
